HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

On the 25th of September 1936, a group of representatives from various missions in Assam met in Shillong, to consider the organization of a council of churches, the Assam Christian Council, in the erstwhile undivided Assam. On the 23rd of September 1937, the authorized group met again to form a committee to set up a college. It included Rev T. E. Pugh, J. M. Forbes, Rev J. J. M. Nichols Roy, and Rai Bahadur D. Ropmay, with Dr Victor Hugo Sword as its Chairman and Treasurer. In 1941, the Assam Christian Council communicated with the other affiliated member churches to generate funds for the noble project, and was assured of receiving four annas from each member, as well as other special gifts. Dr. Sword was entrusted with the task of procuring a suitable site for the proposed college on 28th August 1948. His pleas to the Baptist Church to provide the Guahati campus which had 22 acres of land, was turned down because of the financial burden it would incur. The Council in 1950, thus reaffirmed Barapani as the best location for the project and voted to set the wheels in motion in July 1951, backed enthusiastically by the American Baptist Board. Dr. Sword wrote,

“Those who know the Church in Assam know its strength and weakness through their leaders. The Church should continue to reproduce leaders and the College has that aim to produce such people...Without a Christian College, the Church in Assam has no future”

With such a mission, the College classes commenced on Friday, the 14th of August 1952. The dedication service was held on Saturday, the 29th August 1952 at 12:45 p.m., to coincide with the meeting of Assam Christian Council (21-30 August 1952) in Shillong. The official inauguration ceremony took place on the 7th of November 1953. It was inaugurated by Shri M. M. Choudhury, Ministry for Food and Agriculture, Government of Assam (undivided Assam).

The College began with a humble sum of ₹8,475/- collected from donors. The ecumenical work camp consisting of all the affiliated local churches was organized to clear the jungles and begin the construction work. Volunteers came from the USA, UK, Australia, Japan, Burma, Africa, Sri Lanka and Pakistan to name a few.

Initially there was only one student, (L) Gasperly Marwein. Gradually the strength rose to 11, including one female student. These include: Ownershing Q. Marak, Meghalaya; Yasathung Lotha, Nagaland; Miss. Alice Laurence, Jorhat, Assam; Tekachangt Ao Changki, Nagaland; Sanmongdur Ao, Changki, Nagaland; Plausing K. Marak, Meghalaya; A. S. Tuisem, Ukhrul Manipur; Samuel Hembrom, Goalpara, Assam; Wilfred Goldsmith, Jorhat, Assam, and Elphinstone R. Marak, Meghalaya.

Dr. B. M. Pugh, was the first Principal of the College. The teachers included: (L) Prof. I.

M. Simon, English Department, (L) Mrs. Enid Pugh, Logic Department, (L) Mrs. Mary Abraham, History Department and (L) Mr. Rajaratnam, Economics Department.

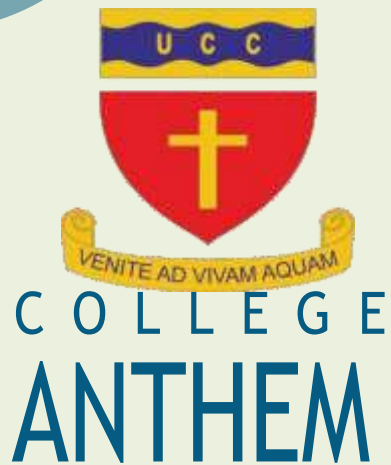

CURRICULUM & CREDIT FRAMEWORK FOR FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES (FYUP)

UG Degree Program with Single Major:

- Major:** The Major is a subject in a core discipline. In the Major, a student must earn 60 credit hours in 3 years and 80 credits in 4 years.
- Minor (Core Course):** The Minor (Core Course) is a subject in a core discipline.
- Honours:** The discipline of focus where a student must earn 92 credit hours in the discipline out of total 160 credit hours of the program. Only those students who secure a minimum of 75% marks in the MAJOR subject will be allowed to take Research Project/Dissertation and will be awarded with “UG Honours with Research” upon securing the required credits. The remaining students must opt for advance courses to be awarded with a “UG Honours”.
- Honours with Research:** An Honours with 92 credit hours in the discipline including 12 credit hours from research/dissertation.
- Change of Major:** Generally, student will be able to exchange between the MAJOR & MINOR, if both the subjects fall within the broad discipline. Preference for the MAJOR change will be given to those who secure highest CGPA with no backlogs in the first year.

Common Courses:

- **Multidisciplinary Courses (MDCs):** MDCs are introductory-level courses relating to any of the five broad disciplines. University has identified a basket of courses from each broad disciplines under Multidisciplinary Courses to broaden the intellectual experience. MDCs form part of Liberal Arts and Science education. Student cannot opt courses which were taken in their Class XII.
- **Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs):** These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students.

- Ability Enhancement Courses (AECs): Students are required to achieve competency in a Modern Indian Language (MIL) and in the English Language with special emphasis on language and communication skills.
- Value Added Courses (VACs): Understanding India, Environmental Science/Education, Digital and Technological Solutions, Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports & Fitness.
- Vocational Education & Training (VTC): A minor subject of the undergraduate programme aimed at imparting skills along with theory and practical.
- Internship: All students will also undergo 120 hours (4 credit) of Internship, Apprenticeships, etc., in a firm, industry, or organization or Training in labs with faculty and researchers in their own or other Curriculum and Credit Framework for undergraduate Programmes HEIs/research institutions during the summer/winter term.

FY-UG Programmes

- a) There shall be three / four-year undergraduate programmes in different disciplines.
- b) The Three-year undergraduate programmes shall be leading to a Bachelor's degree in single major.
- c) The four-year undergraduate programmes shall be leading to a Bachelor's degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research).

Eligibility & Criteria for Admission

- a) A Candidate must obtain a senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary Certificate on successful completion of Grade 12 examination or any other equivalent examination from any recognized Board of Secondary Education.
- b) Admission process shall be based on marks/scores in the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA), or any other authorized agency approved by the University.
- c) Students securing at least 75% marks in aggregate on completion of the third academic year shall be eligible for a 4-year Bachelor's degree programme in Honours with Research. Students securing less than 75% shall be eligible for undertaking Honours only.



GENERAL INFORMATION FOR ADMISSIONS

- Admission to UCC is open to all on merit basis. The selection policies and process are unique.
- We encourage applicants from diverse social, cultural, economic, ethnic and geographical backgrounds.
- The College adheres to State Government Reservation Policy for Admission into Higher Educational Institutes.
- Candidates belonging to reserved categories must furnish their valid certificates as proof of eligibility during the application process.
- Incomplete application forms and applications received after the last date will not be entertained.
- Any student providing incorrect, false or misleading information in the application form shall forfeit his/her admission to the College.
- Admission process shall be based on marks/scores in the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA), or any other authorized agency approved by the University.

Students can apply either online at the admission portal of the College, www.uccadmission.in or alternatively the Admission Forms and Prospectus are also available in the College Office on payment, and may apply for admission during office hours.

5. Please ensure that you have with you scanned copies of the following documents for uploading (size of the document should not exceed 200kb):

- Class XII Marksheet.
- Recent Passport Size photograph (white background).
- Birth Certificate/Class X Admit Card/ Any other birth proof.

1. After filling in the application form, candidates will need to pay the application fee of ₹500 through one of the payments method mentioned below.
2. Click Submit after you have made the application fee payment.
3. Candidates will receive a notification in their mobile no or email regarding the successful submission of the application form.
4. The admission office will verify your documents after which you will receive an email regarding the status of your application.
1. Candidates whose application for admission has been approved are to pay the admission fees within 2 days (non-refundable).
2. After payment of the fee, a copy of the transaction receipt (Student Name, Mode of payment, UTR no, date of payment, amount and Bank with Branch name) must be sent by email to - admissionuccmegh@gmail.com.
3. Candidates will receive a notification in their registered mobile number or email regarding the acceptance of their admission.

GENERAL INFORMATION-II

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is compulsory. Students having less than 75% attendance are liable to be debarred from Examinations. Any student who is absent for one month will be liable to have his/her name removed from the College Registers. Fresh Admission Fees will have to be paid if the student is allowed to join back.

ASSESSMENT OF STUDENTS

Continuous assessment of the students is done by the college through regular tests, project and assignments. There will be Sessional tests and internal assessment test. If a student does not pass, he/she may be debarred from appearing in the End Semester Examinations. The marks secured by the students at these assessment tests are taken into consideration at the time of sending up the students for University Examinations. The Examination Committee's decision in this regard is final and binding. Projects, study tours and field works are essential requirements of a number of degree programmes.

LIBRARY

The College maintains a well-stocked, computerized library, containing different sections devoted to each subject. The college also subscribes to a number of journals in various subjects. The library has a reference section, which houses the journals encyclopaedia, past question papers of the university and other books which are available only for reference purposes. The reading room attached to the library subscribes to journal, magazines and newspapers, both regional and national and also international. The library also houses the internet facility over a number of net-worked computers which is available to the students for research purposes all through library hours. Students are encouraged to augment classroom learning by using the knowledge based available over the internet. On all working days the college Library will remain opened from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00. p.m. Students are request to take advantage of the facilities.

ADMISSIONS TO HOSTELS:

1. Admitted students are to apply for the hostel in the prescribed form for hostel accommodation.
2. Admission /Mess receipts have to be shown to the warden prior to occupying the hostel room/seat. Anyone found violating this shall forfeit his/her hostel seat.
3. Hostel accommodation will be allotted for one academic year at a time. Every student shall submit a fresh application for admission to hostel in every subsequent year of study. The application should reach the Warden of the hostel concerned day before the commencement of the academic session each year. Re-admission will be permitted only after the resident is admitted to a programme of study and after furnishing proof of having paid all hostel/tuition dues.
4. It is mandatory for Girl student to reside within the girl's hostel inside the college campus. Parents are also advised not to allow their female wards to stay outside the College hostels.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR CONDITION OF RESIDENCE

1. All hostellers are to love and respect each other and to stay in an atmosphere of peace and tranquillity.
2. All hostellers are to pay an annual membership fee as prescribed by the Governing Body.
3. All hostellers must stay in the room allotted to them.
4. All hostellers are to be in their rooms during the study hours from 7 a.m. to 8 a.m. and from 7 p.m. onwards.
5. During study hours, Common Room shall be closed and absolute silence shall be observed.
6. All hostellers should be back in their rooms after evening chapel
7. Hostellers are not to leave the campus without the permission of the Vice- Principal / Principal and the warden concerned.
8. The Principal or Vice Principal on the recommendation of the Warden may grant for overnight stay on a written request from the parents/local guardians of the hosteller. Such permission shall be granted only once a month. Residents granted overnight stay permission should be issued passes in which the date and time of return to the hostel shall be indicated.
9. A hosteller who stays out for any length of time without the written permission of the Warden shall forfeit his/her seat.
10. Visitors of the opposite sex will be allowed entry only up to the Visitor's room. The Warden shall have the right to deny to any entry into the hostel.
11. Residents shall be personally responsible for the care and cleanliness of the rooms allotted to them and for the surrounding of the hostels. They shall also be responsible for the safe upkeep of the fittings in the rooms' furniture, other items supplied to them, and any damage will have to be compensated for. More than the prescribed furniture will not be allowed in the hostel rooms.
12. No resident shall remove any property from the Common Room to his or her own room.
13. Use of unauthorized electrical or electronic appliances in the room is not permitted.
14. While the usual and necessary precaution for security of residents would be taken, the college, however, shall not be responsible for any loss of personal property of the residents of the hostels. Residents should take measures for the safe keeping of their property. Residents must provide their own locks for their allotted rooms.
15. The college reserves the right to withhold the results of any course of a hosteller who does not clear all hostel fees/dues in time or for misbehavior. The Warden shall bring such cases to the knowledge of the Principal for necessary action.
16. Keeping of pets/animals in the hostels is strictly prohibited.
17. The college reserves the right to take immediate occupation of any hostel room/seat that has been forfeited.
18. The use of Television sets in hostel rooms shall not be permitted.

19. Personal computer may be used in the hostel rooms only on a written permission from the Warden.
20. Consumption of alcoholic beverages and narcotic substances is prohibited. Any resident found violating this rule shall be immediately suspended / expelled.
21. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the College Campus
22. Hostellers are not to carry food from the Refectory to their hostels.
23. Food will be served in the Refectory only during the serving time.
24. Hostellers are to take active part in the work projects organised in the hostels and college.
25. All hostellers are to regularly attend the Chapel services, hostel prayer service.
26. All hostellers are to vacate the hostels during long vacations. However, a ward may stay for a specified period of time with the permission of the concerned Warden.
27. Any student involved in communal fight will be expelled/suspended from the college
28. Students are liable to be questioned or physically checked by the Security Staff of the College.

DRESS CODE

The following code should be adhered to:

- Hair should be combed and tidy. Long hair are not allowed for boys.
- Semi-formal / formal footwear is to be worn. Bathroom slippers are not allowed.
- T-shirts / Jackets, etc., when worn, should not have abusive or other objectionable language / pictures printed on them.
- Boys must wear full length trousers.
- Boys' shirts / T-shirts must either be half-sleeved or full sleeved.
- Girls' blouses should be sleeved and fall well below the waistline, be modestly cut and not transparent.
- Girls may not wear half or mid-length pants.
- Girls' dresses / skirts must be of length which maintains modesty.
- Face rings, nose rings and lip rings are not to be worn.
- The wearing of earrings by boys is discouraged.
- Caps must not be worn in classrooms and should otherwise be removed deferentially when greeting a member of the Staff. Woolen caps may be worn during winter and when religious purposes require the shaving of the head.

Advisory to the Parents and Guardians, that they do/give:

- ❖ Not to frequently take their wards from the college
- ❖ Not to meet their wards without the prior permission of the Warden
- ❖ Not to meet their wards during class hours, except on certain exigency
- ❖ Confine to the Warden if any specific problem that their wards have.
- ❖ Judicious monetary support to their wards

Students may be suspended, expelled or refused admission to next session for any breach of college or hostel discipline as follows: -

- ❖ Ragging of any nature, which is strictly prohibited in the College.
- ❖ Non-co-operation in College social work or other curricular activities.
- ❖ Absence from class Tests and Internal Examinations.
- ❖ Drunkenness, use of hallucinatory drugs, Gambling, Theft and Indiscipline of any kind in the Hostel/ Refectory/ in the Campus premise.
- ❖ Leaving the hostel and staying overnight outside the campus without prior permission from the Warden concerned.
- ❖ Entertaining unauthorized persons as guests in the hostels
- ❖ Involvement in any illegal and anti-social activities, which may affect the peace and harmony in the College Campus.
- ❖ The College has banned all Tribe Units in the College and no entertainments of outside units are permitted in the campus. This has the approval of the NEICC Annual Conference, 2010.



Ragging is totally prohibited in the institution, and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, whether actively or passively, or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with the UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009 as well as under the provisions of any penal law for the time being in force.

CO-CURRICULAR, EXTENSION ACTIVITIES, ACADEMIC CLUBS & BODIES ETC. ORIENTATION PROGRAMMES

The College organizes Orientation Programme at the beginning of each academic year by the IQAC for the First Semester Students of the College, where the Curriculum Framework of the Under-Graduate Programmes, Semester & Category-wise distribution of Credits and the Common Courses under Multidisciplinary Courses (MDCs), Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs), Ability Enhancement Courses (AECs), Value Added Courses (VACs), Vocational Education & Training are briefed to the new entrants to facilitate the students to opt their choice of courses and as per the pertinent guidelines. The College being Residential, students are given awareness of the general rules and regulations of Halls of Residence within the campus. The students are also made aware of all the pertinent abstracts of UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in HEIs, 2009, before they give their undertakings, Examinations Rules & Regulations, Academic Calendar, and given Value Education to inculcate and foster human values among the students.

STUDENT'S REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL (SRC)

The Council is the official students' body of the college, comprising of elected class representatives from the different classes in order to conduct extra-curricular and academic activities in the College.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The National Service Scheme is a voluntary organization of college students under the Union Ministry of Human Resource Development established during 1969-70 to inculcate social consciousness and a sense of responsibility, discipline and dignity of labour among the youth. The NSS volunteers of UCC Unit participate in various activities viz. Blood donation programmes, Campus cleaning and white washing, Advocacy workshop on HIV/AIDS, Tree plantation programme etc. The College extends support to the NSS in all their activities and upholds the motto of the NSS "Not Me but You".

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

NCC (National Cadet Corps) is a national organization which facilitates in inculcating among the cadets a spirit of courage, confidence, self-reliance, selfless service, a feeling of patriotism, faith in oneself, power of thought and adjustment which are essential to make the youth disciplined and dutiful. The College has an NCC Army & Air wings for both boys and girls under Meghalaya Battalion which extends support to the NCC in all their activities.

DISPENSARY

UCC has a dedicated general physician and staff nurse available on all working days to administer medical services to all the students within the campus as well the staff. It also extends its services to the medical needs of the people in the vicinity.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

As part of the Land Deed agreement with the Syiem of Hima Myllem, the College upholds its social commitment by providing free studentship to students from Meghalaya from the economically weaker sections. The College also supports students from other states who come from the Below Poverty Line on the basis of Merit. The College has also instituted the 'Earn while your Learn' scheme in the College Central Library for students coming from economically weaker sections.

STUDENT CHRISTIAN MOVEMENT OF INDIA (SCMI)

The Student Christian Movement of India (SCMI) Unit is a students' movement with Christian ethos which maintains a fellowship of students, teachers and senior friends with commitment to translate Christian Faith into action and has been in the mission of shaping young leaders with integrity and commitment. The SCM Unit of the College conducts morning services during weekdays as well as Sunday evening. It also conducts quarter visits and organises regular camps and food fests within the campus.

TRANSPORT

The College has its bus services as a mode of conveyance for daily commuters to and from the city and other adjoining villages for both the students and staff of the College to attend their regular classes and duties. College also provides fleet of buses on alternate Saturdays for all the hostellers to ferry them to and from Shillong to facilitate outings to the students. Besides, students are given bus services for other academic visits to study sites, fields, and sports activities when conducted outside the campus.

COLLEGE REFECTORIES

The College has separate refectories for boys and girls. The Mess is looked after by the Mess Committee constituted by the Principal.

Fee: The refectory/mess fee is part of the Hostel Accommodation Package. Fee will be calculated/charged from the date of Admission/the commencement of the classes announced by the college. No adjustment shall be entertained.

The Hostel Accommodation fee is inclusive of:

a) Hostel Rent
b) Mess Fee
c) Refectory Staff Salary
d) Maintenance of refectories and
e) Procurement of Hostel/Refectory requirements.

NOTE:

- b) Students are expected not to waste or encourage wastage of food.
- c) Students are to maintain Mess timing as per notification.
- d) Students are not allowed to carry food outside dining hall except for a sick roommate with written permission from the Hostel Warden
- e) Students are expected to maintain code of conduct in the dining Hall as prescribed in the College prospectus.



SCIENCE / ACADEMIC SOCIETY

The Science Society comprises of teaching faculty, students and laboratory assistants of the Science stream. The Society conducts inter-class Seminars, Science exhibitions, and other academic activities. The Society also looks after the Botanical Garden of the College.

DRAMATIC CLUB

It is committed to artistic enrichment and appreciation of theatre of students. Here, the activities are designed to impart theatre education that emphasizes interactive education, personal growth, and professional preparatory training and community involvement. Dramatic Club occasionally performs selected classical plays that have been prescribed by study course.

ADVENTURE CLUB

This club is aimed at providing various outdoor activities, building camaraderie, active lifestyle and physical well-being by engaging the students in such activities, encouraging members to explore and discover new places through adventurous pursuits and provide them the required outdoor skills and safety knowledge.

YUVA TOURISM CLUB

Tourism in Meghalaya is going through a significant phase of growth and is considered as the major driver to the economic growth of the state. Meghalaya is a state blessed with natural resources like hill, waterfalls, forests etc, there is immense scope for development of tourism. Tourism club of our college was started in the year 2022 with a view to tap potential of this industry. The aim of our club is to make students aware of the opportunities of the industry and also to make them responsible travellers.

ARTS APPRECIATION CLUB

The art club exists to give the students an artistic outlet and to enrich and foster an interest for art and personal expression through art. The College provides ample opportunities to develop talents in different forms of art like skit, music, elocution, painting, drawing, and other forms of arts.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The College being residential in nature has a close bond between students and teachers. This relationship within the campus creates an opportunity to identify oneself as students and teachers with the sense of belonging to Union Christian College. Thus Alumni Association provides the platform for developing this relationship between the past and the present. Alumni members also support the College from time to time whenever the need arises.

BLOOD DONORS' FORUM

This forum is initiated by the NSS and the Student Christian Movement of the College to instil the

spirit of selfless service among the students. This forum will also be under the supervision of the College nurse to help the poor and the needy in times of emergency. The College extends support in all their activities.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

The Cell maintains a conducive and fair educational ambience and redresses the grievances at individual and class level and grievances of common interest, including that of staff. Complaints are mailed by students and parents and oral complaints are redressed from time to time. All complaints are scrutinized by the Principal and the Grievance Redressal Cell.

CHAPEL

Union Christian College, being an educational project of the North East India Christian Council (NEICC), conducts regular worship service for the spiritual development of all the students and staff as well. Worship services are conducted in the Chapel both in the morning and evening, in which the students actively take part. The day-to-day activities of the Chapel are looked after by a full time Chaplain. The College conducts a Retreat Programme once in a year during the month of August.

COUNSELLING AND GUIDANCE

The Career Counselling and Guidance Cell offers free counselling services and conduct sensitizing workshop and training programmes to create awareness, learn coping skills and develop positive mental health.

ANTI-RAGGING SQUAD

The Anti-Ragging Squad under the Leadership of the Hostel Wardens is committed to prevention of cases of anti-ragging activities within the campus.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC)

It is headed by a senior female Presiding Officer and other members, the major functions of which entail forceful implementation of the policies relating to the prevention of sexual harassment, strive to resolve complaints by the aggrieved complainant and henceforth, recommend actions to be initiated by the employer.

SPORTS COMMITTEE

Sports, both outdoor and indoor, play a very important role in the life of UCC. Every UCCian is encouraged to take an active part in the sports activities of the College. Within the campus itself, there are two Basketball courts, two Volleyball courts, a Badminton court and a Tennis court. It also has access to the mini stadium at the old campus of the college for Football. Apart from this, facilities for almost every indoor game is provided within the college itself. The College Week is a

special time when every form of sports activity takes the front seat.
